PRIMARY SCHOOL SURVEY 2026

The Board appreciates your engagement with the Primary School Survey 2025 and for taking the time to consider the results shared in previous Home School correspondence on 18 June 2026 (also available on the website).

As you may recall, the survey (undertaken by the DEY in November & December 2025) sought views from our school community relating to our school's future direction. The survey results reflect a diversity of views. Given the closeness of the outcome and the significance of this matter for our school in the years ahead, the Board wishes to ensure that any decision taken is informed by the broadest possible consultation. STAFF MEETING & EARLY CLOSURE (Tuesday, 29 September at 1.50pm)

In order to facilitate a staff meeting, pupils will finish and leave school on **Tuesday, 29 September at 1.50pm**. SUMMER WORKS 2026

Over the years, through various grants from the Department of Education & Skills, voluntary family contributions and Parents' Association fundraising and the generous efforts of the local community, the school has been able to add to its physical infrastructure to meet growing needs. The school community has a strong historical commitment to maintaining the integrity of the fabric of the physical learning and working environment and it is encouraging that such a commitment is on-going.

Over the summer break, an extensive deep clean, upgrade, maintenance and repair works were undertaken throughout the school, as well as the school grounds receiving their usual late summer tidy ahead of re-opening.

ANNUAL VOLUNTARY FAMILY CONTRIBUTION 2026/2027

While the Board of Management continues to exhaust every possible avenue in terms of available funding, the **Annual Voluntary Family Contribution** plays a very significant role in bringing about such improvements, as outlined above. Given the increased costs associated with expenditure in respect of the school's many wide-ranging operational and educational resource requirements, the Board requests an **Annual Voluntary family Contribution of €60.00**. In the interest of safety, ease of payment and to assist with administration, the school is facilitating e-payment in respect of this voluntary collection - families will receive a text tomorrow, Tuesday, with related payment advice details. The aim of the programme is to empower children to become active participants in creating, maintaining and boosting positive mental health throughout their lives.

'MANNERS MATTER' MONTH

As part of the school's *Social Personal & Health Education (SPHE)* programme, pupils learn to care for and respect others including how people interact, communicate, live, play and work together. The development of a range of communication and interpersonal skills will add to a child's experience of life at home with their families, in school and the wider community as well as serving them well in various settings later in adult life. During the month of September, pupils will explore the role that manners play in relating with others through role-play, drama, stories, poems, quotations and print in our environment (e.g. receipts). The importance of whole body listening, what good manners look like at home/school, social media manners, good sportsmanship, giving and receiving compliments, respecting differences, greetings and common courtesies will form part of the basis of class exploration on this topic.

Aladdin 'Connect', an online school communication/organisation/administration facility, assists parents in relation to advising the school in respect of pupil absences, allows parents to update family contact details, provide various permissions in relation to certain activities, regular school news via notice-board message updates and furnishes families with the annual school report card.

Thank you to families who have **1) registered 2) downloaded the related app and 3) validated mobile phone number (please complete all 3 steps, the attached information sheets 'Parent Signup for Connect' & 'Set Up App Parents' will assist).**

Given the significant pupil numbers in the school, digital communication will be key in the facilitation of school organisation and arrangements for 2026/2027. **As advised last School Year (2025/2026), owing to rising costs, the school has discontinued sending messages, via text. Instead, messages will be sent via the Aladdin 'Connect' app message service. To receive same, it is important that all parents/guardians have verified their mobile number on Aladdin 'Connect'.**

The school now requests that one or both parents from each family to sign-up for *Aladdin 'Connect'* as this will be used increasingly as the school's main communication means (please refer to the related information sheet attached). For parents who now wish to sign-up for 'Connect', another unique access code will be forwarded by text on Wednesday morning.

ePayment Facility Details

The school uses the Aladdin software service for administrative purposes and the ePayment system will give you access from an internet browser on your computer, phone or tablet to make secure payments to the school using your credit or debit card. The purpose of the ePayment system is to facilitate the easier payment of school money collections for parent/guardians and to reduce the amount of cash and cheques being sent into our school in line with recent Central Bank directives.

Aladdin uses state of the art security to safeguard information entered by you and the school and data is stored and processed in strict compliance with Irish data protection laws. Normal debit and credit card usage costs will apply.

On receiving a text containing your **payment access link**, you will be brought to a parent payment page which will contain payment details requested for your child's/family's money collection. You will require a phone with internet access or, alternatively, you can type the related link in an internet browser on a computer to make an ePayment. Once you have completed your payment, you will be issued with a reference number. Please quote this reference number in any queries you may have regarding this payment with the school.
