ICT & PUPIL LEARNING

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LITERACY DEVELOPMENT

Literacy stations are beginning across the school. Stations allow for small group discussions, fun oral language games and paired-reading. They give children lots of opportunities to read books at their own level of competency and gradually lift the complexity of what can be done in both reading and writing. Complementary activities further enhance our literacy development programme, both third classes participated in a Cork County Council Library zoom webinar with Alan Nolan, Children's Author, earlier in October, as part of 'World Teachers' Day'. Alan Nolan summarised his most famous books and gave the pupils a great insight into what they are about. Using the chat box feature, the pupils had an opportunity to ask Alan Nolan some questions and, to conclude, the pupils engaged in a 'draw with Alan Nolan' activity where they drew two characters from his books.
