DAILY SCHOOL TIMETABLE & ASSEMBLY/DISMISSAL

The Board of Management wishes to remind families of the school's daily school assembly and dismissal arrangements:

- 9.00 9.10am Outside assembly
- 9.10 9.20 Classroom Assembly (all pupils are expected to be in school by no later than 9.20am)
- 1.50pm Junior & Senior Infant departure (from the main school gate)
- 2.50pm All other pupils depart (from the main school gate)

The school premises will open to receive pupils at 9.00 am. For their own health and safety, the children are not permitted to enter the school grounds any earlier than 9.00am and parents/carers and pupils are advised not to gather outside the school before 9.00am. Upon arrival at school, from 9.00am onwards, pupils should go straight to their designated class lines for outside assembly.
